

Alpinizem in odprave v tuja gorstva

Alpinism and expeditions to foreign mountain ranges



Slovenski alpinizem po naši prvi himalajski odpravi na Trisul leta 1960 s svojimi dosežki v najvišjih gorstvih sveta skokovito začne postajati svetovna velesila. Med dosežki jih omenimo le nekaj: prvenstveni vzpon na vrh Makaluja po južnisteni 1975, prvenstveni vzpon po zahodnem grebenu na vrh Everesta 1979, prvenstvena smer v južni steni Lotseja 1990 in prvi neprekinjen smučarski spust z vrha Everesta 2000.

Komisija za alpinizem

pokriva področje alpinistične dejavnosti. Skrbi za usklajevanje in usmerjanje razvoja slovenskega alpinizma s poudarkom na vrhunskem alpinizmu, pripravlja in organizira akcije z alpinistično vsebino ter izvaja alpinistična usposabljanja. V letu 2011 je ustavila alpinistično reprezentanco. Vsako leto organizira tabor alpinističnih družin, alpinisti veterani pa se srečujejo na letnih srečanjih.

Njena dejavnost je usmerjena v organizacijo in pomoč reprezentančnim odpravam ter taborom za perspektivne alpiniste v najvišja gorstva sveta. V povezavi s tem skrbi tudi za promocijo slovenskega vrhunskega odpravarstva (himalajizma, andizma) v svetu, pridobiva sponzorje, sodeluje s tujimi gorniškimi organizacijami in od leta 1979 vodi Slovensko šolo za gorske vodnike v Nepalu.

After its first expedition to Trisul in 1960, Slovenia has rapidly developed into one of the world's leading climbing countries. Its reputation is built on the achievements of its climbers in international mountain ranges, including, but not limited to, a new route on the South Face of Makalu in 1975; a new route along the western ridge of Mount Everest in 1979; a new route on the South Face of Lhotse in 1990, and the first continuous ski descent from the top of Mount Everest in the year 2000.

The Commission for Alpine Climbing

covers all alpinism-related activities. It coordinates and promotes the development of Alpine climbing in Slovenia, in particular top-level alpinism, organizes and runs various events and campaigns, and carries out various forms of Alpine climbing training. In 2011 the Commission set up the Slovenian National Alpinist Team. Every year the Commission organizes a camp for climbing families. Veteran alpinists also meet regularly at annual gatherings.

The Expedition Commission

The primary activities of the Expedition Commission are the organization and support to the National Team's expeditions and the camps for promising young climbers in the world's highest mountain ranges. The Commission is also responsible for the promotion of Slovenia's top-level expeditions (e.g. to the Himalayas and the Andes). It seeks sponsors, works with foreign mountaineering and climbing organizations, and runs the Slovenian School for Nepal Mountain Guides.
