Odbor Gore in varnost

je skupni odbor Planinske zveze Slovenije in Gorske reševalne zveze Slovenije, ustanovljen na podlagi podpisanega skupnega dogovora o sodelovanju. One of the fundamental tasks of the Alpine Association of Slovenia (Planinska zveza Slovenije) is to raise the awareness and strengthen the knowledge about the nature and safe mountain walking in all visitor groups, in particular the children and youth. The Alpine Association of Slovenia accomplishes its mission through its members, commissions, and qualified staff and collaborators.

The Commission for Training Standards and Prevention

is the highest professional body of the Alpine Association of Slovenia, which prepares professional basis for mountaineering-related training programmes, with particular emphasis on prevention. The Commission upholds the Alpine Association of Slovenia doctrine, applies the common organizational principles and beliefs relating to the training of professional mountaineering experts, coordinates prevention measures and mountain safety programmes with focus on the most important risk factors, and monitors the development of all mountaineering-related issues in the Republic of Slovenia.

The prevention and research activities of the Alpine Association of Slovenia will be further enhanced by the newly formed research group.

The Mountains and Safety Committee

is a joint committee of the Alpine Association of Slovenia and the Mountain Rescue Service of Slovenia, and was established on the basis of a signed cooperation agreement. Both signatories shall promote mountaineering skills and knowledge in all mountain visitors; coordinate prevention programmes to improve mountain safety; foster the transfer of knowledge and experience among professional staff; ensure the exchange of expert material; and present good practice cases in both organizations and the general public.
