



### Športno plezanje

Komisija za športno plezanje skrbi za razvoj športnega plezanja v Sloveniji in s tem povezano usposabljanje strokovnih kadrov, urejanje športnih in naravnih plezališč, kategorizacijo športnikov, organizacijo domačih in mednarodnih tekmovanj ter vodenje državne reprezentance. Tekmovanja na mednarodnem nivoju potekajo pod okriljem Mednarodne zveze za športno plezanje (IFSC).

Slovenska članska in mladinska reprezentanca dosega odlične rezultate v evropskem in svetovnem merilu. Največji uspehi:

- 2007 **Maja Vidmar** – skupna zmagovalka svetovnega pokala v težavnosti

- 2008 **Natalija Gros** – evropska prvakinja v balvanih in evropska prvakinja v kombinaciji, Pariz (FRA)
- 2008 **Klemen Bečan** – prva moška zmaga za Slovenijo v svetovnem pokalu v težavnosti, Kranj (SLO)
- 2009 **Maja Vidmar** – zmagovalka v težavnosti na svetovnih igrah, Kaohsiung (TPE)
- 2010 **Mina Markovič** – evropska prvakinja v kombinaciji, Imst (AUT)

### Tekmovalno turno smučanje

Komisija za tekmovalno turno smučanje skrbi za športno zvrst, ki združuje elemente planinstva, turnega smučanja, teka na smučeh in alpskega smučanja ter od športnikov zahteva številna gorniška znanja, izkušnje in odlično telesno pripravljenost. V okviru komisije tekmuje slovenska reprezentanca, ki se udeležuje tekmovanj v domačih in tujih gorah.

### Tekmovalno ledno plezanje

je organizirano v podkomisiji Komisije za alpinizem PZS. Svetovni pokal v tem športu poteka pod okriljem Mednarodne zveze planinskih organizacij UIAA. Udeleženci se na tekmah slovenskega in svetovnega pokala pomerijo v težavnosti in hitrostnem plezanju. Slovenska članska reprezentanca je zlasti v letih 2010 in 2011 dosegala lepe rezultate.



### Sport Climbing

The Commission for Sport Climbing is responsible for the development of sport climbing in Slovenia and the related training of professional staff, arrangement of artificial and natural climbing structures and areas, classification of climbers, organization of domestic and international competitions and the operation of the Slovenian National Team. International competitions are held under the auspices of the International Federation for Sport Climbing (IFSC).

The Slovenian national team and its younger selections have enjoyed fantastic achievements in the European and world-level competitions:

- 2010 **Mina Markovič** – European Champion in Overall Women, Imst (AUT)

### Competition Ski Mountaineering

The Commission for Competition Ski Mountaineering is responsible for the sport which joins the elements of mountaineering, ski touring, cross-country skiing, and alpine skiing, and requires athletes to possess varied mountaineering knowledge, rich experience, and excellent physical fitness. Within the Commission, a national team has been formed, which regularly takes part in the competitions held in Slovenia and abroad.

### Competition Ice Climbing

is organized within the sub-commission of the Commission for Alpine Climbing of the Alpine Association of Slovenia. The World Cup in Competition Ice Climbing is organized under the auspices of the UIAA. The Slovenian and World Cup climbers compete in lead and speed ice climbing. In 2010 and 2011 the Slovenian National Team has earned several good results.
